SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

SECTION 6: Accidental release measures

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures: Ventilate closed spaces before entering them. ELIMINATE all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks or flames in immediate area). Keep upwind. In case of spills, beware of slippery floors and surfaces. Keep away from sources of ignition - No smoking.

6.2 Environmental Precautions:

Avoid release to the environment. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Do not contaminate water sources or sewer. Prevent from spreading (e.g. by binding or oil barriers).
